GROWING THE GAME



First Tee - Canada will target to launch multiple chapters in 2021 with a growth strategy to establish First Tee Chapters in markets across Canada through 2023. The inaugural First Tee - Canada chapter launching in 2021 will be located in Victoria, BC at the Bear Mountain Golf & Tennis Resort Community which is also home to Golf Canada's National Training Centre. A First Tee Chapter in Quebec will also be launched shortly thereafter, continuing the incredible legacy of past Presidents Cups. With support from the Presidents Cup, First Tee has successfully launched global chapters in Australia (2019) and Korea (2015).

Through its deep network of donors and trustees, Golf Canada Foundation will be a critical partner in supporting the launch and advancement of First Tee - Canada through its fundraising and philanthropic efforts. Canada's Provincial Golf Associations will also play a role in the advancement of First Tee - Canada as chapters begin to form in markets across Canada. In addition, Golf Canada will continue to work with the NGCOA Canada (National Golf Course Owner's Association) and other key industry stakeholders towards a more inclusive golf experience for Canadian youth.





WORLD HANDICAP SYSTEM

Golf already has a single set of playing rules, a single set of equipment Rules, and a single set of rules for Amateur Status governed by the USGA and The R&A. Yet prior to 2020 there were six different handicap systems used around the world by various handicapping authorities such as Golf Australia, the Council of National Golf Unions (CONGU) in Great Britain and Ireland, the European Golf Association (EGA), the South African Golf Association (SAGA), the Argentine Golf Association (AAG) and the United States Golf Association (USGA).

Each authority is well developed and successfully provides equity for play locally, but each of the different systems produces varying results when calculating players' handicaps. The World Handicap System unified these six systems into a single system which enables golfer of different abilities to play and compete on a fair and equal basis, in any format, on any course, anywhere in the world. The system is easy to understand and implement, without sacrificing accuracy and meets the varied needs and expectations of golfers, golf clubs, and golf authorities all around the world.

The WHS will encompass both the Rules of Handicapping and the Course Rating System (formerly known as the USGA Course Rating and Slope System). The World Handicap System launched in Canada on January 8th, 2020. This transition to the WHS allowed Handicap Index calculations to be consistent for all players, making a Handicap Index comparable to all other players around the world.



WHAT ARE SOME OF THE THINGS YOU NEED TO KNOW AS A GOLFER?

1. Your Handicap Index may change. But that's okay! Finally, players around the world will have an apples-to-apples handicap. Your new Handicap index will be more responsive to good scores by averaging your eight best scores out of your most recent 20. In short, your Handicap Index will be determined by your demonstrated ability and consistency of scores. In most cases for golfers in Canada, the change will be less than a stroke.

2. You need to know your Course Handicap. In the new system, your Course Handicap will be the number of strokes needed to play to par. This will result in greater variance in the Course Handicap per tee and presents a change, as historically it has represented the number of strokes needed to play to the Course Rating. The Course Rating will now be inherent within the calculation to be more intuitive and account for competing from different tees.

3. Net Double Bogey. The maximum hole score for each player will be limited to Net Double Bogey. This adjustment is more consistent from hole-to-hole than compared to our previous procedure. Net Double Bogey is already used in many other parts of the world and the calculation is simple: Par + 2 + any handicap strokes you are to receive that hole.

4. Playing Condition Calculation (PCC). The playing conditions calculation that determines if conditions day-to-day differ from normal playing conditions that could impact player performance based on those course conditions, weather conditions, and course setup. The good news is all this will be calculated behind the scenes on the Golf Canada Score Centre. If PCC shows that players performed significantly better/worse than expected, it will adjust score differentials accordingly.

5. Safeguards in the new system. The new system will limit extreme upward movement of a Handicap Index, automatically and immediately reduce a Handicap Index when an exceptional score of at least 7 strokes better is posted, and account for abnormal course or weather conditions to ensure that scores reflect when a course plays significantly different than its established Course Rating and Slope Rating.



20 MUST KNOW RULES OF GOLF

1. DROPPING THE BALL

A drop is now to be made from Knee Height (NOT Shoulder Height) **RULE 14.3b**

2. MEASURE THE AREA TO DROP

In 2019 you will measure the area to drop with the longest club in your bag (except a putter) **Def. Club Length**

3. RELIEF AREA

Drop ball in relief area and play from the relief area. **RULE 14.1**

4. DROPPING THE BALL ON A LINE

When dropping back-on-the-line, your ball cannot be played from nearer the hole than your chosen reference point. **RULE 17.1d(2), 19.2b, 19.3b**

5. TIME TO SEARCH FOR A LOST BALL

The allotted time to search for a lost ball is 3 minutes (NOT 5 minutes). **RULE 18.2a**

6. ACCIDENTALLY MOVING THE BALL WHILE SEARCHING

If you accidentally move your ball when searching for it, replace it without penalty. **RULE 7.1, RULE 7.4**

7. DOUBLE HIT

No penalty for an 'accidental' double hit. It only counts as one stroke. **RULE 10.1a**

8. BALL ACCIDENTALLY HITS YOU OR YOUR EQUIPMENT

No penalty if your ball accidentally hits you or your equipment after a stroke. **RULE 11.1**

9. BALL STRIKES THE FLAGSTICK

No penalty if your ball strikes the flagstick when you have chosen to leave it in the hole. **RULE 13.2a**

10. REPAIRING DAMAGE ON THE GREEN

Spike mark(s) and other shoe damage on the putting green can be repaired. **RULE 13.1c**

11. BALL ACCIDENTALLY MOVED ON PUTTING GREEN

Ball or Ball Marker accidentally moved on putting green - no penalty and ball or ball marker must be replaced. **RULE 13.1d**

12. BALL MOVED BY WIND ON PUTTING GREEN

Ball marked, lifted and replaced on putting green is moved by wind to another position - replace ball on the original spot. **RULE 13.1d(2)**

13. PENALTY AREAS

Penalty areas replace water hazards. You can move/remove loose impediments, ground your club and take practice swings in a PA without penalty, just as you can in the general area -> provided you do not cause your ball to move. **RULE 17.1 - Def. Penalty Area**

14. RELIEF FROM PENALTY AREAS

You can't take relief from a penalty area unless you are 95% certain your ball is in the penalty area. **RULE 17.1d**

15. LOOSE IMPEDIMENTS IN BUNKERS

In bunkers you can move loose impediments, provided it does not cause your ball to move. **RULE 12.2a**

16. GROUNDING YOUR CLUB IN BUNKERS

In bunkers you cannot touch the sand with your club in the area right in front of or right behind your ball, during your backswing or in taking practice swings. **RULE 12.2b**

17. FREE RELIEF FOR EMBEDDED BALL

Free relief is if your ball is embedded on the general area (but "embedded" means part of your ball is below the level of the ground, in its own pitch-mark -> not from a divot in the general area). **RULE 16.3**

18. UNPLAYABLE BALL IN BUNKER

Unplayable ball in bunker - extra option to drop outside the bunker for 2 penalty strokes, back-on-the-line. **RULE 19.3b**

19. CADDIE OR PARTNER STANDING BEHIND YOU

You cannot have your caddie or your partner standing behind you once you begin taking your stance. **RULE 10.2b**

20. PACE OF PLAY

It is recommended a player takes no longer than 40 seconds to make a stroke (and usually you should be able to play more quickly than that) and Ready Golf in stroke play is encouraged. **RULE 5.6b**


