

GOLF NL JUNIOR CODE OF CONDUCT

Golf NL takes great pride in the quality of its players, host facilities and broad community involvement at each tournament. In order to continue making Golf NL tournaments enjoyable for everyone, the Association requires all members to adhere to a set of guidelines known as the Code of Conduct. Its purpose is to help Golf NL participants grow and mature by understanding and accepting the consequences of their actions. The **Code of Conduct** is to be followed throughout the junior's stay at the tournament.

Violations of the Code of Conduct "ON" the Golf Course

- Unsportsmanlike conduct, including abusive language, club throwing, disrespect to volunteers, officials or fellow competitors, or abuse of golf course property.
- Use of drugs or alcohol, smoking or chewing tobacco products.
- Failure to adhere to the dress code during practice round or tournament play

Violations of the Code of Conduct "OFF" the Golf Course

- Any use or association with drugs or alcohol, smoking or chewing tobacco products.
- Any vandalism at a host hotel, abusive behaviour to host family or their property.
- Any other conduct not becoming of an Golf NL member.

Dress Code – Required Dress:

- Hats/visors (if worn) must have the brim facing forward
- Polo shirts with or without sleeves
- Sleeveless shirts **MUST** have minimum 4 inch seam at the shoulder
- Dress T-shirt including V-neck, Mock neck, Turtle neck
- Women's shorts/skorts must extend below the outstretched fingertips while standing

Dress Code – Prohibited Dress:

- Tank tops, T-shirts.
- Denim shorts, short-shorts, cut-off shorts, gym shorts, jeans.
- Men's shorts must not be below knee length and may not be rolled up.
- Shoes with metal or traditionally designed spikes.

Proper attire is required at all times at the host facility. The Tournament Committee will review questionable attire. Should a host facility have a stricter dress code, its policy will take precedence. Players in violation of the Dress Code will not be allowed to tee off or, if the violation is discovered once play has begun, the player will be asked to immediately discontinue play.

Code of Conduct Penalties

1. A verbal warning may be given by an Official or Tournament Organizer
2. A Code of Conduct violation may result in a written letter to the player and parent/guardian.
3. A player's entry is subject to rejection at any time (including during the Championship) by the Golf NL. The reason for rejection may include unbecoming conduct.
4. Disqualification from future Golf NL sanctioned tournament(s).

The Golf NL Tournament Committee may assess any or all of the preceding penalties based on the severity and frequency of the violation(s). Golf NL will discuss the Code of Conduct at the tournament's Players Meeting.
